Richard W. Hunter, Ph.D. President Hunter Research, Inc.

Hunter Research, Inc., is a historical and archaeological consulting firm that has been based in Trenton for more than 25 years. Richard was born and attended school in England, emigrating to the United States in 1977. He received a B.A, in Archaeology and Geography from Birmingham University (U.K.), an M.A in Archaeological Science from Bradford University (U.K.), and a Ph.D. in Geography from Rutgers University. He is a board member and past Chair of the Trenton Downtown Association, a former board member and President of Preservation New Jersey, a past member and Chair of the Hopewell Township Historic Preservation Commission, and a trustee of the Trenton Museum Society. Among his many publications on New Jersey archaeology and history, he has contributed to the recently published Encyclopedia of New Jersey (2004) and Mapping New Jersey: An Evolving Landscape (2009), and co-authored Hopewell: A Historical Geography (1990) and "The Historical Geography and Archaeology of the Revolutionary War in New Jersey" in New Jersey in the American Revolution (2005).
